Balanced ETFs

ETFs are increasingly popular forms of packaging and many firms offer Asset Allocation funds (aka Balanced funds)

- **Count:** 40 ETFs are placed in the Diversified Portfolio ETFdb Category.
- **Expense Ratio:** Range from 0.25% to 2.96%
- Average Expense Ratio: 0.87%
- Trading Vol: Average volume is 22K, with the most active > 100K to least active < 1000
- Availability:: Average age is 4 yrs, with the oldest is 11 yrs, while 60% are less than 3 years old
- **Commission Free**: Only 6 ETFs are offered commission free on some discount brokers

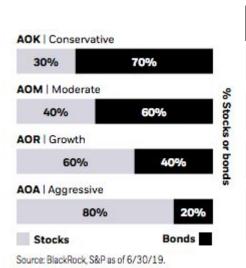
Pros

- Simple all-in-one fund option for those who like ETFs
- Allocation available to match different risk profile / investment horizon
- Usually hold a basket of ETFs (similar to mutual funds) but some hold stocks and bonds too
- Range from simple passive strategy to more complicated like active, leverage
- Commission free trading available with discount brokers

Cons

- ER is slightly higher than if you select funds yourself
- Limits tax efficient fund placement
- Difficult to rebalance if you own other funds
- Low trading volume, higher spread
- Usually not available in 401(k) retirement plans

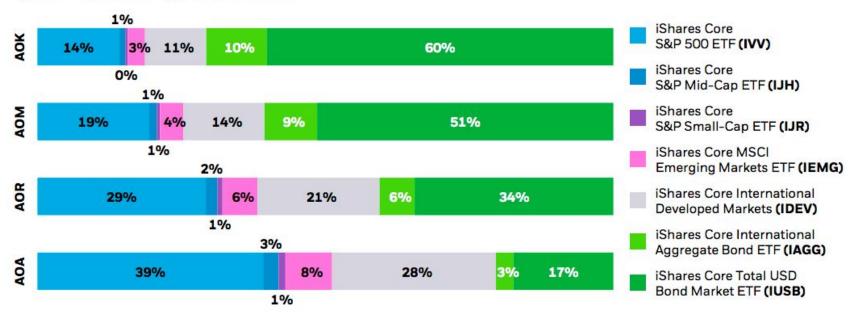

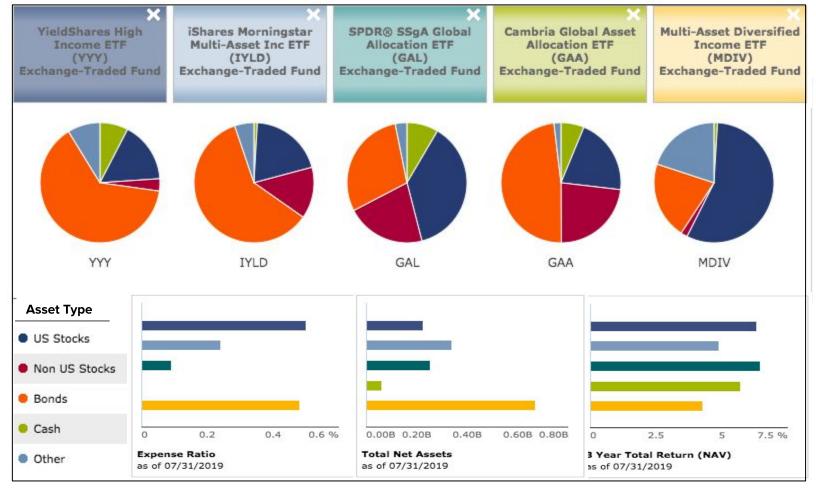
iShares Core Allocation Funds

Final Thoughts

- At 25 bps, the iShare Core Allocation funds are the least expense offerings compared to similar ETFs. However, Vanguard's LifeStrategy and Fidelity's Four-in-One funds charge 14 and 11 bps, respectively.
 So, the argument that ETFs are cheaper than funds doesn't fly in this case.
- There's also the belief that ETFs are more tax efficient than funds.
 AOA has a 3-year tax cost ratio of 0.98, while VASGX is 0.91 and FFNOX is 0.71.

Balanced investments are available in ETF form, but surprisingly not at the cost or tax advantages most people would imagine.
